Sermon Discussion Questions

We encourage you to use these for personal study or for small group conversations around the sermon text. You can meet over the phone or online with one or two other people to go through these questions and to pray together.

- 1. Retell the story of Judges 16 together. Check the passage to see if there is anything you missed.
- 2. What stands out to you in this story? What questions do you have?
- Take a look at Samson's relationship with each person in the chapter: the prostitute, Delilah, the Philistines, and God. What do his interactions with each of them reveal about Samson and what is important to him?
- 4. Anthony notes that it is was the absence of God's presence, and not the action of shaving his head, that resulted in Samson losing his strength. Why might the Lord have left Samson in verse 20?
- 5. What are the two reasons that Anthony mentions that might affect our ability to experience God's presence today? Have you ever seen these in your own life?
- 6. Whatever the reason God feels distant, he desires that ultimately this lead to greater intimacy with him. Does knowing this help us to know how best to respond when God feels distant? If so, how might we respond?
- 7. At the end of Judges 16, Samson asks God for his strength rather than relying on his own. Practically, what might it look like to rely on God's strength in the circumstances of our lives this week?
